Three important things

"We should learn three important things from the fact that God is Holy a. *First*, that there is a chasm between God and the sinner; Isaiah 59:1,2, Habakkuk 1:13; not only is the sinner estranged ("to turn from an affectionate and friendly attitude, to an indifferent, unfriendly, or hostile one; alienated") from God, but God is estranged from the sinner. Before sin came, man and God had fellowship with each other; now that fellowship is broken and impossible. b. <u>Secondly</u>, that man must approach God through the merits of another, if he is to approach Him at all. Man neither possesses nor can acquire the sinlessness that is necessary for access to God. But Christ has come and made access possible; Romans 5:2, Ephesians 2:18, Hebrews 10:19,20. Thirdly, we should approach God 'with reverence and godly fear.' Hebrews 12:28,29. Right views of the holiness of God lead to right views of sin; Job 40:3-5 and Isaiah 6:5-7 are striking examples of the relation between the two. IMPORTANT - Humiliation, contrition, and confession flow from a Scriptural view of the holiness of God.' (Henry C. Thiessen, "Lectures in Systematic Theology", p 129)
