God's mercy is mentioned 135 times in Psalms, beginning in Psalm 4:1.

Mercy is one of God's names and titles ("the God of my mercy," Psalm 59:10). Mercy is a fundamental essence of God's character. This theme rises to a great crescendo in Psalm 136, which repeats the expression "for his mercy endureth for ever" in all 26 verses. The psalmist recounts some major aspects of God's deeds and character: goodness, Psalm 136:1, God of gods and Lord of lords, Psalm 136:2-3, doer of great wonders, Psalm 136:4, creator of the heavens, Psalm 136:5-9, judge of Egypt, Psalm 136:10-12, divider of the Red Sea, Psalm 136:13-15, leader of Israel through the wilderness, Psalm 36:16, conquerer of the Canaanite kings Psalm 136:17-20, giver of the land to Israel, Psalm 136:21-22, protector of Israel, Psalm 136:23-24, and provider of sustenance to all creatures, Psalm 136:25. But in the midst of all this, and as the basis for all of this, is God's eternal mercy, for which men should continually give thanks.

God's mercy endureth for ever. This is repeated 34 times in the Psalms, 26 times in Psalm 136 alone. It was a major theme at the dedication of Solomon's temple (II Chronicles 5:13). It will be the theme in Christ's kingdom.

"Thus saith the LORD'; Again there shall be heard in this place ... the voice of them that shall say,
Praise the LORD of hosts: for the LORD is good; for his mercy endureth for ever" (Jeremiah 33:11).
God's mercy is founded on His Word ("be merciful unto me according to thy word," Psalm 119:58; Romans 10:17).

That 'God's mercy endureth for ever' is to be declared. Psalm 118:2-4.

Sincere Seeking & Searching ...

" ... is an evidence of sincerity and a Scriptural command and condition to 'finding'. Jeremiah 29:13,

'And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart.'

The "Conditions" of Forgiveness

"We see then that God does not forgive sinners indiscriminately without conditions being met. In the same manner, these same conditions are necessary for the child of God to be forgiven on an ongoing basis. This is understood by the conditional "If".

For Old Testament saints,

"If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." - II Chronicles 7:14

For the New Testament saints,

"If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." - I John 1:9

In the same manner, forgiveness by man to man is conditional. Many people emphasize the teaching of Jesus regarding the unlimited, unconditional nature of the forgiveness expected of the offended brother in Matthew 18:21-22 and Luke 17:3,4; but fail to note that repentance is required of the offender. The conditional aspects of forgiveness are made clear in ... Matthew 6:14-15, Mark 11:25-26 and Luke 6:37.

For God to forgive us, we must meet the conditions. We must remember that fellowship is dependent upon forgiveness, and forgiveness is a conditional act based on (the) acknowledgement and repentance of the sin that destroyed the fellowship. For us, (being) the offending party, to be forgiven ... (including repentance) we must ask! This is the same also for forgiveness to be granted from person to person. For too long, many Christians, offended by sin and
